COVID-19 testing is NOT available in Mayo Clinic Health System Emergency Departments or clinics

Please note COVID-19 testing is not available inside Mayo Clinic Health System campuses, including the Emergency Department.

Spirometry Testing

Due to the current outbreak of COVID-19, the American College of Occupational and Environmental Medicine (ACOEM) has advised to suspend routine spirometry testing. Spirometry test require performance of a forced expiratory maneuver which could spread

droplets in the air if an infected person is tested, even if they are asymptomatic. Because of this risk to the patient care environment we will be temporarily suspending routine spirometry testing. Urgent needs for a spirometry test will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.
